We're so happy to have you here. Our main goal is to create a warm, inclusive, and safe environment where everyone can fully enjoy themselves. That's why we ask all attendees, artists, professionals, and volunteers to carefully read and respect this Code of Conduct before participating in any activities.

A safe and inclusive space

Spring Lindy Weekend is an event open to everyone, regardless of race, age, gender, sexual orientation, religion, nationality, physical appearance, dance experience, or dance role. We want you to feel good and we expect you to do your part in helping others feel good too: treat everyone with kindness, care, and respect.

We have a zero-tolerance policy for any form of harassment, including, but not limited to:

- Offensive or inappropriate comments
- Deliberate intimidation
- Stalking or unwanted following
- Photography or recording without consent
- Unwanted physical contact
- Unwanted sexual attention, in person or online

Inappropriate behavior may result in immediate removal from the event and being reported to the authorities.

If you experience or witness any inappropriate behavior, please don't hesitate to reach out to our support team. They are here to help and will take the necessary action. You can easily identify them by their fluorescent green wristbands. They have received specific training to respond appropriately to situations involving harassment or discomfort. All reports will be taken seriously, and your anonymity will always be respected.

On the Dance Floor

- Ask for dances politely, and always respect a "no" without demanding an explanation.
- Show appreciation and say thank you after each dance.
- Respect your partner's boundaries, and communicate your own as well.
- Maintain eye contact and connection. Don't dance roughly or attempt tricks or aerials outside of organized jams.
- Be aware of your surroundings: avoid collisions and protect your partner.

Hygiene and Personal Care

- Shower before classes and parties.
- Change your shirt if you've been sweating heavily.
- Avoid unpleasant odors. Dancing with someone who is soaked or has a strong smell is not enjoyable.

In Class

- Arrive on time. Punctuality is essential. If you arrive late, you may lose the right to join the class.
- Listen carefully to the instructors and follow their guidance. They're here to help you grow, so respect their experience and judgment.

With the Bands

 Show your appreciation after each song. A simple round of applause can create a positive atmosphere and boost the energy of the party.

Alcohol and Mindful Enjoyment

We want you to have fun, but we also want you to do so responsibly. If you choose to drink alcohol:

- Do so in moderation.
- If you're not in a good condition to dance, drink water, rest, or call it a night.
- Don't put your safety—or anyone else's—at risk.

ANTI-RACISM STATEMENT

Racism remains a significant issue in contemporary European society, and its effects reach everyone, directly or indirectly. To confront it, it is essential to activate our empathy and understanding by educating ourselves about the experiences, histories, and realities of affected communities.

Recognizing their origins, history, and ongoing impact is a necessary act of respect and justice. It is not only about enjoying these dances and music, but about understanding the context they come from and the legacy of struggle and resilience they represent.

ANTI-RACISM STATEMENT

To combat racism and inequality within our community, it is essential to become aware of our own privileges and the often-invisible biases we may carry. This includes reflecting on the cultural appropriation that continues to occur within Lindy Hop and Swing communities, both in Europe and around the world.
